Review: Past simple and continuous

Review: Past simple

Past simple: actions that happened at a stated or implied time in the past.

Review: Past simple

I went to bed late last night.

Olivia didn't visit the Louvre Museum when she was in Paris.

Did you have breakfast this morning?

He came home at 7 p.m. and played video games.

Notice the time expressions that go with past simple.

What were you doing at 5 p.m. yesterday?

Mark was listening to music while he was running.

Past continuous: an action in progress at a specific time in the past, two or more actions in progress at the same time in the past.

What were you doing at 5 p.m. yesterday?

Mark was listening to music while he was running.

Notice the time expressions that go with past continuous and the use of 'while' for two actions happening simultaneously.

What were you doing at 5 p.m. yesterday?

Mark was listening to music while he was running.



I cut my finger while I was cooking.

They weren't sleeping when the fire started.

Past continuous:
a past action in
progress when
another action
interrupted it (past
simple).

I cut my finger while I was cooking.

They weren't sleeping when the fire started.

Notice the use of 'while' + past continuous for a longer action in progress.

We can also say "I cut my finger when / as I was cooking."

Notice the use of 'when' + past simple for a shorter action which interrupts the action in progress.

I cut my finger while I was cooking.

They weren't sleeping when the fire started.



Review: Past continuous vs Past simple

Notice the difference in meaning.

When my friends *arrived*, my mum was cooking dinner.
When my friends *arrived*, my mum *cooked* dinner.
